ITEM 304 QUESTION ON NOTICE FROM COUNCILLOR HUDSON RE KIRINARI SCHOOL

The following Questions on Notice have been received from Councillor Hudson and the answers are provided.

1. When was the block of adjacent land fronting Oxford Terrace purchased by Council from the School?

Answer

The land was purchased by the Council from the School in 2000.

2. Under what circumstances ie, who initiated the purchase and for what reason?

Answer (this was provided at the Council meeting)

In a report to Council on 28 August 2000, regarding the acquisition of property on Oxford Terrace (Number 41). The report states "Kirinari School have raised the possibility of the City of Unley purchasing the Kirinari properties at 18 Trimmer Terrace Unley and 41 Oxford Terrace Unley, on a lease back basis to the School." A letter addressed to the City of Unley (Mr Cleve Coyle) on 23 August 2000 from the Kirinari School, thanks the Council for a meeting to discuss the possible sale of 41 Oxford Terrace to the Council and outlined the reason for the sale as being "in order to improve the school's resources".

3. What is the approximate current value of the land?

Answer

This was provided in Confidential Item 70, September 2011.

4. Based on the above figure, which I believe to be above \$400 000, what would be a reasonable annual rental for the land?

Answer

This answer was provided in a confidential paper to the Elected Members at the Council meeting.

5. In the decade or so since Council purchased the land, what rental has been received?

Answer

No rental has been received.

6. If the answer is 'nil', why has the school, a commercial concern, been allowed free use of a Council asset, to the detriment of ratepayers?

<u>Answer</u>

See Question 8.

(Note: The School would be considered not for profit when assessed in accordance with Council's Property Management Policy COU 53)

7. Is the Administration aware that I have raised the rental issue on numerous occasions in the past decade?

<u>Answer</u>

Yes.

8. Why has no action been taken?

Answer

There have been numerous reports and debate regarding this property including consideration of use as a car park as well as a potential sale.

In March 2010 (639/10) Council resolved not to offer a long term lease to Kirinari School.

In June 2011 (item 44/11) Council resolved to enter a short term agreement with the School but also resolved to consider sale of the property in the short term. Potential sale was debated in September and October 2011. Now that this issue has been resolved, the June 2011 resolution will be actioned and a short term agreement will be entered.

9. Using the Federal Government's BER funds, has Kirinari School in recent times, erected additional classrooms on the only open space it actually owns?

Answer

The School has recently constructed additional classrooms on its own land, ie not Council's land. There is now minimal open space available.
